Elmer Walter Murray

E. Walter Murray, born on December 24, 1912, in what it is now the Camellia Inn, has lived in the same house on Healdsburg Avenue for over 92 years. His parents and uncle built the house and had him drive the first nail so he would always remember his part in building it. For the last 50 years, Walter has bred rare Red Factor canaries, which he sells throughout the 50 U.S. states. Today, at 96, he cares for over 250 birds.

Josephine Brignole Camaur

Josephine Camaur was born in November 1914 just north of Asti on a ranch her mother owned and managed. One of her daily chores was to herd over 100 sheep back to the barn. But she had time for fun too. In 1930, at the age of 14, Josephine was crowned Geyserville's May Day Queen, a tradition that still exists today, by San Francisco Mayor James Rolph. For the last 65 years Josephine has lived on a ranch on Dry Creek Road where she manages her acre and a half of Zinfandel and grows over 200 varieties of roses.
